

TALK OF THE WEEK: INDIAN EXPERT AWARDED FOR MENTORSHIP BY SANATA DHARMA UNIVERSITY

Yogyakarta's Sanata Dharma University (USD) recently awarded strategic advisor, writer and educationist Amol Titus, an Indian expatriate, with its prestigious Best Mentor Award.

Titus is the first Indian to be accorded this honor. It is the third award he has received from an Indonesian university, alongside awards from the Bandung Institute of Technology and Binus University International Jakarta.

For over 15 years, Titus has been actively engaged in supporting the country's education sector through teaching, skills-based training, institutional development and excellence and mentoring of youth and professionals.

Since he first came to Indonesia in 1998, Titus has taught, trained and mentored around 5,000 individuals in Indonesia.

"The first two awards were related to subject expertise and teaching, while this award is for mentorship. So in a way, this is a recognition of my evolution from a lecturer and a coach to becoming a mentor," Titus said.
